The Clerk read from the Agenda as follows:

1. Submitting the appointment of Peter Lurgio, 51 Overlook Drive, as a member of the Parks and Recreation Commission (Ward 4), to fill a vacancy due to the untimely death of Robert (Chico) Veronesi, for a term to expire the first Monday of February 2023.
2. Submitting the reappointment of Christine Webster, 39 Blue Sky Drive as a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals, for a term to expire the first Monday of

February, 2024. (amended to read from Alternate member to Permanent Member, replacing Gary Bacchiocci)

At this time a Moment of Silence was offered in memory of long-time Park and Recreation Commissioner Robert (Chico) Veronesi was passed away this past week.

REPORTS OF CITY OFFICERS - None

PETITIONS, REMONSTRANCES, AND OTHER PAPERS

3. A PUBLIC HEARING was held on a petition for a zoning amendment at Section 2-20, 3-40, 50, 110, 120 and 4-30.4(1) relative to residential kennel restrictions, particularly lot area, to leave more discretion to the Special Permit granting authority.

City Planner Jay Vinskey was present to represent the petition. He informed the Council that the Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) requested that some of the codified residential kennel restrictions relative to lot area and number of dogs be loosened and have it be a special permit process through the Planning Board. He explained that currently the zoning ordinance allows for 3 dogs in a residence and if it is 4 to 9 dogs a residential kennel (residential kennel to be amended to home kennel) is needed by Special Permit of the Planning Board and that the minimum size lot of 60,000 square feet is required and must be in Rural Residential. Due to many residents requesting relief from the ZBA and the ZBA unable to grant the relief because the Ordinance states 60,000 square feet is needed and that it be in Rural Residential, the ZBA filed the petition to loosen the restrictions. Therefore, it is being requested that the 60,000 square feet be deleted and also add residential kennel (home kennel) to Residence A and have the Planning Board review each case by case. Councilor Adams expressed his concern that these issues were dealt with years ago and not sure that the square footage should be changed and that someone may get a residential kennel (home kennel) whereas someone may not. Councilor Mello questioned if the 150 minimum setback is changing. Mr. Vinskey replied that the setback is for commercial kennels and that is not changing. Councilor Mello requested clarification that there would be no minimum size lot relative to square footage. Mr. Vinskey replied that is correct, no minimum lot size, it would be up to the Planning Board. Councilor Allie informed the Council that it depends on what the property is abutting when determining the size of the lot and is comfortable with letting the Planning Board review each application case by case. Councilor Matthews-Kane asked what a home kennel is. Mr. Vinskey replied that currently it is called a residential kennel and is being requested to be amended to home kennel and that if a resident wants 4 up to 9 dogs they have to apply for residential (home) kennel. Councilor Matthews-Kane asked what the change is to Residence A. Mr. Vinskey replied that currently a residential (home) kennel is not allowed in Residence A and that the amendment would allow 4 dogs in Residence A by Special Permit. Councilor Matthews-Kane asked why only Residence A, why not other residential districts. Mr. Vinskey replied that Residence A is mostly single family homes on larger lots and that the Planning Board would look at each lot size during the Special Permit process. Councilor Figy asked what the recommendation from the Planning Board is from their public hearing on the

petition. Mr. Vinskey replied that the Planning Board gave a unanimous, positive recommendation. Councilor Mello questioned if the Law Department looked at the proposed ordinance amendments and that taking away the square footage may be prejudicial against renters. Mr. Vinskey replied yes the Law Department did review the proposed ordinance. Councilor Morganelli commented that the public should be able to do what they want as long as not violating a noise or stench ordinance, but will go along with the Planning Board's recommendation. Councilor Flaherty commented that it's nice to be able to do what you want on your own property but there are regulations needed for the quality of life for neighbors. Councilor Flaherty questioned if this is part of the Master Plan. Mr. Vinskey replied that the Master Plan has not really kicked off yet. Councilor Adams questioned if the dog officer has been asked to give input as the dog officer would know more about how much space each kind of a dog would need. Mr. Vinskey replied not in particular but that the dog officer monitors kennels. Scott Clark, 22 Overlook Drive questioned if this amendment would eliminate size restriction in Residence A? Mr. Vinskey replied that the ordinance would not have minimum lot size, it would be up to the Planning Board to determine if the lot size is appropriate. Mr. Clark expressed his concern with eliminating the lot size and leaving it up to the discretion of the Planning Board. With no others to be heard and upon motion of Councilor Flaherty, it was VOTED: That the Public Hearing be CLOSED and be REFERRED TO ZONING, PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE.

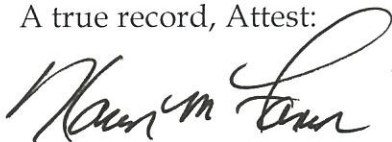

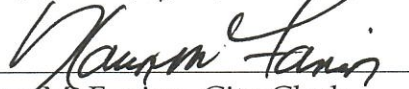
