HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP PROPOSAL APPLICATIONS**

The Office of Community Development and Planning will conduct two public hearings on **Tuesday, January 14, 2020, at 11:00 am and 6:00 pm** to discuss community development needs and priorities for U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds for the First Year Action Plan Fiscal Year 2020 and the 2020 – 2024 Consolidated Plan.

The hearings will take place in City Hall, Room 315, 59 Court Street, Westfield.

The City of Westfield Office of Community Development and Planning will utilize the information from the public hearing to make funding decisions for the federal Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG). Applications for the funding under this program are available beginning on Monday, at the Office of Community Development and Planning, City Hall, 3rd floor, during normal business hours.

FFY 2020 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) proposal applications for funding of activities in the City of Westfield to benefit low and moderate income persons or low and moderate income areas in the City will be available beginning on Monday, December 30, 2019. Eligible activity categories include Public Services, Public Facilities, Housing, Public Infrastructure, and Economic Development.

Agencies and organizations seeking CDBG funding for activities must call or email the Office of Community Development to request instructions and an application.

All CDBG applications are due by Friday, March 6, 2020 at 4:00 pm.

FFY 2020 funding will be for activities undertaken from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The City of Westfield CDBG and HOME Allocations have not yet been determined by HUD, but the City anticipates a CDBG allocation of \$350,000.
